Do not go directly to medical institutions. Instead, please consult the Call Centers for Japanese Returnees and Potential Contacts.

- You have had cold symptoms and/ or a fever of 37.5 degrees Celsius or higher for four days or more.
- * Two days or so for the elderly and persons with underlying conditions (including those who have to take antipyretics constantly)
- You feel a strong sense of fatigue and/ or have difficulty breathing.


Municipal taxes and fees can be paid easily via PayB

PayB is a smartphone payment app that allows you to pay taxes and fees anytime and anywhere via your pre-registered bank account by just reading the barcodes printed on payment notices with your smartphone's camera.



You can pay municipal taxes or fees via PayB if a barcode is printed on the payment notice. You do not have to go to a financial institution, convenience store, or elsewhere but instead can make instant account-to-account transfers. We highly recommend it.





Applicable financial institutions

Shiga Bank, Kansai Mirai Bank, Japan Post Bank, Mizuho Bank, MUFG Bank, Resona Bank, AEON Bank, etc.

Precautions on use

- No receipts will be issued.
- No light motor vehicle tax certificates will be issued. Contact the Zeimu Ka if you need a certificate.
- You cannot pay via PayB if the payment amount for a payment notice exceeds 300,000 yen, no barcode is printed on the notice or the payment is overdue.
- You can download the PayB app for free. However, all communication fees, including packet communication fees, for downloading or using the app are borne by the user.

The insurance premium rate in the Medical Care System for Older Senior Citizens for FY2020 and FY2021 has been announced

Medical costs are increasing year by year due to aging of the population and advances in medical services. To ensure an appropriate level of insurance revenue for medical costs and maintain stable operation of the system, the insurance premium rate for fiscal 2020 and 2021 has been revised.
