Be Prepared in Case of **an Emergency**

「もしも」に備えてできること

One year has passed since the Noto Peninsula earthquake occurred on January 1, 2024. Last August, a Nankai Trough Earthquake Advisory was issued, warning of a potential megaquake. This advisory reminds us that earthquakes can happen anywhere, at any time. Let's take this opportunity to review how we can prepare for disasters, drawing on the experiences of city staff who were dispatched to Noto.

Preparing for Emergencies and Helping Each Other

Disaster preparedness can be divided into three categories:

1. Self-help: Protecting yourself and your family.
2. Mutual assistance: Helping each other in cooperation with neighbors, acquaintances, and friends.
3. Public assistance: Support provided by governmental authorities.

After the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake, about 80% of the victims were saved by their families and neighbors. This highlights the importance of self-help and mutual assistance in protecting yourself during emergencies.

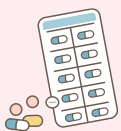

After a disaster strikes, people are
more likely to experience stress due to
changes in their living environment, such
as going to an emergency shelter far
away from where they have been living.



Evacuees who had to move far from their homes told me of their struggles. Many found it hard not having their usual tasks like farming or housework, which they used to do all the time. Some couldn't sleep due to worries about the future. These experiences made me reflect on the kind of care I would need if I were affected by a disaster and what measures I could take in advance.

Damage to Lifelines Caused by the Earthquake

If an earthquake damages essential services like electricity, gas, and water, these lifelines may be shut down for an extended period. This is because fires and aftershocks can prevent their restoration.

What You Can Do Now

Stockpile Food and Water in Advance

Stockpile food, drinking water (3 liters per person per day), and daily necessities for at least three days, preferably for one week.

It is recommended that you consume your stockpile regularly, purchase what you have consumed, and stockpile it again. Even foods with rather short expiration dates can be considered as emergency rations if consumed on a regular basis. This method is called rolling stock in Japanese.

Useful Items in Times of Disaster!

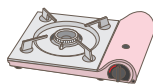
Some everyday items can be useful in times of disaster. Camping gear is especially useful when electricity and gas are cut off.

Compact type tents are recommended



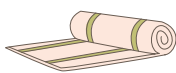
Tents

Water Containers

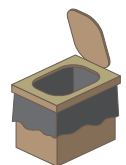
Convenient during a water stoppage!

Prepare an Emergency Toilet Kit, too!

Estimation:

Minimum 5 times per day × 7 days

Choose a toilet kit that can be sealed to prevent spreading smells and ensure sanitation.



In the event of a disaster, human waste can be disposed of as burnable trash.



After the Noto Peninsula earthquake, it took a long time for the water supply to be restored. Toilets couldn't be flushed, so I had to use plastic bags instead. We even had to collect snow to get water. This experience taught me the importance of being prepared in advance to stay as comfortable as possible until essential services are restored.





Evacuate in the Event of an Earthquake!

If your home isn't secure after an earthquake, do not hesitate to go to a public evacuation center.

Possible Risks of Staying Home After an Earthquake



The House Might Collapse

Even if the house is safe immediately after the earthquake, there is a risk that it may collapse suddenly due to aftershocks.

You may become trapped under the house.



Unable to Get Relief Supplies

If you stay at home without contacting others and do not go to an evacuation center, you may not be able to assess the situation properly and supplies may not be delivered.



Unable to Confirm Your Safety

Many people stayed in their homes immediately after the earthquake. However, support for food and daily necessities is first distributed at evacuation centers. It is easier to get information and confirm people's safety if they are at evacuation centers. In addition, public evacuation centers are considered to be resistant to earthquakes. Although you may feel safer in your familiar home, it is important to go to an evacuation center if you cannot confirm that your home is safe.

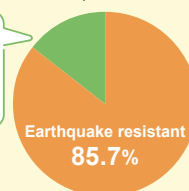
Free assessment of earthquake resistance is available for wooden houses built before May 31, 1981.

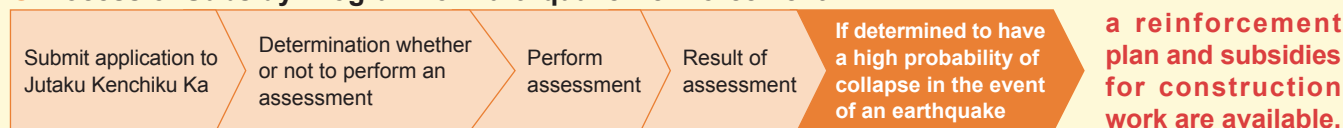


Percentage of Earthquake Resistant Buildings in the City (as of 2020)

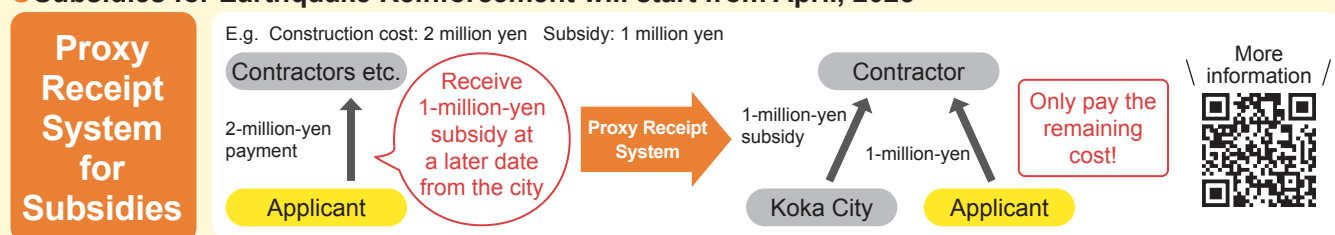

● Subsidies for Earthquake Reinforcement will start from April, 2025



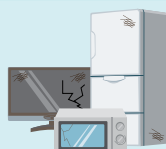

Waste Disposal After Disasters

If a disaster causes a large amount of waste due to furniture and other items being destroyed, the city may set up a temporary waste storage area. To avoid having trouble sorting waste when a disaster strikes, be sure to confirm disposal procedures on a regular basis.



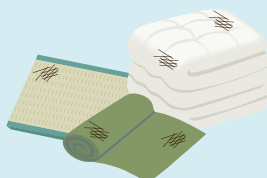
Type of Disaster Waste

Futons, tatami mats, carpets etc. that no longer be used due to the disaster

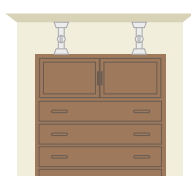


Broken glass and ceramics damaged in a disaster

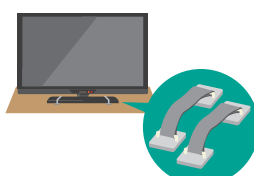
What You Can Do to Reduce Disaster Waste



Dispose of unneeded items such as furniture



Secure all potentially unstable furniture



Subsidies for the installation of furniture securing equipment are available!



Certain requirements must be met to be eligible.



To Prevent Fires Caused by Earthquakes

Install Earthquake-sensitive Circuit Breakers.

When an earthquake occurs, there is a risk of electrical fires starting from appliances during power restoration and tremors. Earthquake-sensitive circuit breakers can prevent these fires by automatically tripping the breakers and shutting off electricity when an earthquake is detected.



Subsidies are available for residents who meet certain requirements.



Issued in a Minimum of One Week! Express Issuance of My Number Card Now Available

マイナンバーカードの特急発行がはじまりました

Eligible Persons

- Those who are under one year old (application can be made at the same time as the birth notification)
- Those who have moved into Koka City from outside of Japan
- Those who need to have their My Number Card reissued (only for the following reasons)
 - ・ Having lost your My Number Card.
 - ・ Having no more space to write additional information in the box on your My Number Card.
 - ・ Your My Number Card has been burnt.
 - ・ Your My Number Card has been damaged and it doesn't work properly.

Application Period

Within 30 days from the date of becoming eligible for express issuance of a My Number Card.

Example: For a person who moved to Koka City from outside of Japan, within 30 days from the date of submitting the moving-in registration.

Steps from Application to Issuance

- ① Application at the counter
 - Apply for express issuance of My Number Card
 - Set your PIN number
 - Have your portrait photo taken
- ② The card will be sent to your home from the government by registered mail.

Note: If the application is submitted at the same time as the birth certificate or if there are a large number of applications for express issuance, the arrival of the card may take more than one week.

My Number Card for Persons Under 1 Year Old

My Number Cards for those under one year of age became photo-less as of December 2, 2024. (No photo is required at the time of application.)

What Is Required for Application

- Identification documents (A or B)
 - A: Two photo IDs (such as driver's license)
 - B: One photo ID + One photo-less ID (such as an insurance card)
- My Number Card (if you have one)
- Lost report receipt number (in the case of loss outside home or theft)

Note:

- If you do not have any of the above IDs, please contact the Shimin Ka at City Hall.
- The above is not required for applications made at the same time as birth certificate submission.
- A fee is required to reissue lost cards

Penalties Will Be Incurred for Riding Bicycles While Using Smartphones and for Riding While Drunk

自転車の「ながらスマホ」と「酒気帯び運転」が罰則強化

The amendment to the Road Traffic Law came into effect on November 1, 2024.

Smartphone Use While Riding Bicycles

The act of using a smartphone or other device while riding a bicycle is now prohibited and subject to penalties*.

Since the minimum age for arrest is 14, junior high and high school students should also be cautious.

*Using a smartphone on a stopped bicycle is not subject to arrest.



More than 20% of all traffic accidents are caused by bicycles. To prevent serious accidents, please follow the traffic rules.

Drunk Bicycle Riding and Related Offences

In addition to drunk riding on bicycles, penalties are also imposed on persons serving alcohol to cyclists, for being the passenger of a drunk cyclist, and for letting a drunk person use a bicycle.

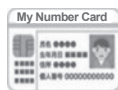


Are You Ready to File Your Tax Return with Your Smartphone?

 - ② Password for user certification (4-digit number)

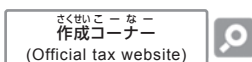

Declaration of Depreciable Assets by January 31

償却資産の申告が始まります

In addition to land and houses, depreciable assets (machinery in factories, exterior and paved areas of houses and parking lots for rent, and business assets such as solar power generation equipment) are also subject to property tax.

Property owners are required to report the assets they own as of January 1 of each year.

Eligible Persons and Corporations

As of January 1, individuals or companies operating factories or stores, or renting out parking lots or apartments, and owning business assets (including the landlords of such assets) in Koka City.
